

**TAPPAN ZEE HIGH SCHOOL  
CLASS OF 2006**

1. A total of 220 graduates received their diplomas on June 22, 2006
    - a. 211 diplomas were issued as follows:  
Female 104 Male 107
    - b. 9 IEP diplomas were awarded to Special Education students as follows:  
Female-3 Male-6
  2. Of the 211 students receiving a high school diploma 126 students (60% of the class) graduated with Honors as follows:  
  
Highest Honors (average of 95 and up – 39 (Female 22; Male 17; 18% of the class)  
High Honors (average of 90.0 to 94.99- 53 (Female 32; Male 21; 25% of the class)  
Honors (average of 85.0 to 89.99- 41 (24 Female; 17 Male; 19% of the class)
  3. Of the 211 diplomas, all 211 students were eligible for **Regents** diplomas:  
95% (201 students) earned a **Regents** or **Advanced Regents Diploma**  
71% (151 students) earned an **Advanced Regents** endorsement on their diploma  
24% (50 students) earned a **Regents** endorsement on their diploma
  4. Of the 194 **Regular Education** graduates, 189 students (94%) earned an **Advanced Regents** or **Regents** endorsement on their diploma as follows:  
  
**Advanced Regent's** seal – 91 students ( Female 46, Male 45 ; 47% of the class)  
**Advanced Regent's** seal with Honors- 57 students (Female 31, Male 26; 29% of the class)  
**Regent's Seal** – 41 students (Female 20, Male 21; 21% of the class)
- Of the 17 special Education graduates 12 students (71%) earned an **Advanced Regents** or **Regents** endorsement on their diploma as follows:
- 19% **Advanced Regents** seal – 3 students ( Female 1, - Male 2)
  - 56% **Regents** seal- 9 students- (Female 1, Male 8)
5. 79% of the class (167 students) is going to a 4 year college or university:  
  
87 female; 80 male  
  
19% of the class (41 students) is going to a two-year college, business or technical school-  
Female 26 Male 15  
(this number includes 5 students to Rockland Community College Honors Program:  
Female – 3 Male-2  
2 students entering the work force (Female 1- Male 1)  
1 student entering the Armed Services (1-Male)
  6. There were 9 seniors in the Science Honor Society 4% (Female 2 - Male 7)
  7. There were 60 seniors (28%) in the National Honor Society  
Female- 32-Male- 28
  8. There were 23 seniors (11%) in the Mu Alpha Theta Math Honor Society  
Female 10 - Male 13
  9. There were 4 seniors (2%) in the English Honor Society:  
Female-3-Male-1
  - 10 There were 10 seniors (5%) in the Italian Honor Society  
Female 3- Male 7

11. There were 16 seniors (8%) in the Spanish Honor Society  
Female 13- Male 3

12. Of the 242 seniors on the rolls as of September 25, 2005 there were a total of 242 potential graduates:  
9 students withdrew: Female 2- Male 7  
4 students entered the GED program (BOCES): Female 1 – Male-3

9 students did not complete requirements for graduation (Female 3, Male-6)
